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Pot of Gold Wall Hanging by Crystalized Designs

# Materials



- o Yarn: See page 4
  o Hook: Furls Odyssey L 7.00mm, or hook to match gauge
  o Scissors
  o Yarn Needle
  o Measuring Tape
  o Tape
- o Stitch Marker
- o Glue gun and glue sticks
- Optional: Plastic Canvas, Wooden Dowels long enough to cover the width of the wall hangings size, embellishments

# Pot of Gold Hanging!

Create a 3D wall hanging that really catches everyone's eye! This hanging is for all that love the rainbow after the rain, or a March Holiday Hanging. Pot of gold can hold chocolate gold coin treats! Yummy!


# Sizing

- These measurements are approximated, and actual subjects may vary.
- Gauge: Using Biggo Yarn and L 10 sc = 4" 11 rows = 4"
- This pattern comes in the following sizes:

Size	Length	Width
Large	18″	12″

# Pattern Key

- Ch: Chain
- Sc: Single Crochet
- BLO: Back Loop Only
- Slst: Slip Stitch
- St(s): Stitch(es)
- \*: Repeat according to instructions



#### Special Pattern Notes:

- This pattern is worked in the round continuously. Use a stitch marker to keep track of the first or last stitch. Working in the round reduces ends to weave in and allows for a nice backing. Plastic canvas can be inserted before closing so the wall hanging keeps its shape better when hung.
- This pattern uses crochet, weaving, and fringe techniques. Find how to add fringe <u>here</u>. Watch this <u>video tutorial</u> of how to weave/assemble.
- The wall hanging is worked from the top down. Stitch counts include chains.
- Embellishments may include, but are not limited to: Bells, floral/greenery, pinecones, tassels, shells, stones, air succulents, wooden cutouts, etc

### Yarn Used (all purchased from We Crochet)

- Color A: <u>Background Color</u> Biggo
- Color B: <u>Background Fringe Color</u> Wool of the Andes Tweed Worsted in Prussian Heather
- Color C: <u>Clouds</u> Gloss Roving in Bare
- Color D: <u>Pot</u> Mighty Stitch Super Bulky in Ash
- <u>Rainbow Colors</u>: Use either Mighty Stitch Super Bulky (one strand) or Mighty Stitch Bulky (4 strands held together)

Pattern Instructions

### Background of Hanging

Ch 31 with Color A

Round 1: Starting in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, 2 sc, sc in next 28 chs, 2 sc in last ch, rotate to work down opposite side of chains, sc in next 28 chs - 60 sts

Use BLO for following rounds.

Rounds 2-16: Sc in each st around - 60 sts

- Round 17: Sc in next, \*ch 1, skip 1, sc in next, repeat \* around 60 sts
- Round 18: Ch 1, skip 1, \*sc in next ch 1 space, ch 1, skip 1, repeat \* sts around 60 sts

Finish off and weave in ends.

## Pot

With Color D, ch 6

- Row 1: Starting in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, sc across 5 sts
- Row 2: Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in same, sc in next 3, 2 sc in last 7 sts
- Row 3: Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in same, sc in next 5, 2 sc in last 9 sts

Row 4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across - 9 sts

Edging: Ch 1, rotate piece to work down raw edge, 4 sc evenly down side, ch 1, rotate piece to work beginning ch, sc in each 5 chs, ch 1, rotate piece to work up opposite side of raw edge, 4 sc evenly up side, ch 1, join to first ch 1 - 26 sts

Finish off and weave in ends.

### Rainbow Colors

Using the Furls Lucet Fork, and 4 strands of bulky or 1 strand of super bulky yarn, make the following i-cords at roughly the measurement indicated:

- Red: 19"
- Orange: 18.5"
- Yellow: 16.5"
- Green: 14.25"
- Blue: 12.5"
- Purple: 11"

### Assembling the Wall Hanging

Find a video tutorial <u>here</u>. Stitch the Pot with the edge of the pot even with the left edge of background with the lowest part of Pot on Round 16.

### Adding the Rainbow

Starting with red, tuck one ends partially into pot and curve to opposite side. Opposite end should be slightly even with Rounds 16-18. Once all colors are arched, use glue gun and glue sticks to glue down one color at a time keeping the arched shape. After bottoms of i-cord are glued down, add glue to sides of colors to keep the background from showing through if needed.

## Weaving the Wall Hanging

Weaving will only be worked in the chain 1 spaces. Take roving and tape the ends. Start weaving the roving from Round 17 across (working over ends of rainbow colors), and then back on Round 18. Make as fluffy as desired or repeat once more. Weave in ends.

#### Background Fringe

Cut 24" strips of Color B. With thinner yarn, more strands per fringe will be needed, thicker yarn will need less. Add 3 strands of fringe to back ch 1 spaces and single crochets. Find a fringe tutorial here.

# Optional

- Cut plastic canvas just under the measurements of your top portion of wall hanging (Rounds 1-17). Insert canvas and sew up bottom using Color A and working under cloud so sewn area is not visible from front.
- Weave in all ends. Single crochet wooden dowel on top of wall hanging (or attach a strand to each corner for hanging).

Add any embellishments.
